The conference and exposition takes place in the Virginia Beach Pavilion Convention Center June 8-10.

The conference will also feature four panel sessions focusing on specific aspects of transformation: Operational Challenges from Operations Enduring and Iraqi Freedom; Intelligence and Decision Superiority; Transformation and Prototyping; and New Paradigms for C2 and Decision Superiority.

Over 50 exhibitors will display their products and solutions at Transformation TechNet, and attendees will gain insight into the emerging technologies that will make transformation possible. The exposition includes local companies, large defense contractors, small businesses, and government agencies.

Transformation TechNet will also provide three transition assistance courses for military and government personnel transitioning to the private sector. Resume writing and interview techniques will outline the skills needed to make this change; "Troops to Teachers" will instruct military personnel how they can transition to a new career as a public school teacher in a "high-need" school.

Transformation TechNet offers numerous professional development and networking opportunities.
